The Julia Keefe Indigenous Big Band (JKIBB), an all-Indigenous 16piece big band, premiered at the Washington Center for the Performing Arts in Olympia, WA on May 19th, 2022.



Indigenous jazz musicians, ensembles, and big bands have their place in the contemporary jazz world as well as in jazz history. There were small ensembles and big bands on reservations across the US in the first half of the Twentieth Century and several Indigenous musicians who ascended to celebrity with jazz as their medium.

Since time immemorial, songs have been the vessels for prayers and stories for the Indigenous people of the Americas. The goals of JKIBB are to celebrate and continue that tradition, to compose and perform new music inspired by traditional melodies, and to create a community of likeminded peoples from all backgrounds to uplift the next generation of Indigenous jazz musicians.

Indigenous cultures are not monolithic. JKIBB reflects a wide range of Indigenous cultures, from South America to Canada, Northeast to Southwest. Together they represent a long silenced, long-forgotten chapter in history: the participation, contribution, and legacy of Indigenous jazz musicians. JKIBB is both a reflection of a time long forgotten and a window into the future. It is the bridge for all peoples to see themselves on the bandstand regardless of race, ethnicity, age, gender, or socioeconomic status.
